Additionally, each intern is paired with a full-time staff member to act as a mentor throughout the duration of the internship.

"We know when our interns graduate, they are prepared for working in the real world and have the knowledge and talent required to create meaningful solutions to the problems facing healthcare and healthcare IT today. The PSM Program trains students in both science and professional skills to make them highly competitive in the STEM-related workforce. There are five PSM programs offered: Applied Statistics, M.S., Biostatistics, M.S., Cell and Molecular Biology (Biotechnology), M.S., Health Informatics and Bioinformatics, M.S., and Data Science and Analytics, M.S.

"This year, Grand Valley's Professional Science Master's Program placed interns in more than 50 different companies or organizations," said Anirudh Chowdhary, Affiliate Faculty and Professional Science Master's Programs Coordinator. "MiHIN stands out as being an exceptional employer not only because of the real-world experience that they offer interns, but because of how quickly and effectively they were able to pivot and move their interns entirely online due to the pandemic, while still providing a meaningful experience."
